Practice: Equations with 1 Solution, No Solution, or Infinite Solutions

Solve the equation, then say whether it has 1 solution, no solution, or infinite solutions. (If it has one solution, you need to say what the solution is!)

1) $4x - 8 = 2x + 12$	2) $5x + 3 = 5x + 4$	3) $10y - 5 - 10y = -5$	4) $10x + 2 = 7x + 2$

5) -2(x-1) + 9 = 2x + 7 6) 7(x+2) - x = 2(3x+7) 7) 4x + 9 - x - 2 = 3x + 9 8) $\frac{1}{2}(8x-6) = 3 - 4x$

9) Pick **three problems**: one that was one solution, one that was no solution, and one that was infinite solutions. Check your answer for each one. Check the one solution problem by plugging that number in. Check the no solution problem by plugging in TWO numbers (any ones you want!) and verifying that they both don't work. Check the infinite solutions problem by plugging in TWO numbers and verifying that they both <u>do</u> work.

10) Challenge: Right now, Ms. Bolus is five more than $\frac{2}{3}$ of Mr. Lischwe's age. The sum of Ms. Bolus's age and Mr. Lischwe's ages is 60. How old is each teacher?
